The work included grooming and dethatching of both courts, herbicide treatment, liquid fertilising and top-dressing the extension area near the carpark hut along with other small areas across the courts. Thanks to this combined effort, the courts are now looking fantastic and ready for plenty of enjoyable play.

## Proud of our people

Throughout February, Annette and Sandy (both valued members of the Autumn Centre) joined forces with Annette's daughters, Sarah and Fiona, to take on The Big Bold Swim in support of Breast Cancer Trials. Their commitment and teamwork made for an inspiring effort. As team "Still Making Waves", they set a fundraising target of \$500. Thanks to the generosity of supporters, they didn't just reach that goal, they tripled it. Together, the team swam 28 kilometres and raised an impressive \$1,509.

A special acknowledgement goes to the Autumn Singers group, whose contributions helped bring Annette's personal fundraising goal to \$294.45. Their support was deeply appreciated.

Breast Cancer Trials operates Australia's only independent clinical trials research program, uniting more than 980 researchers across hospitals and medical institutions in Australia and New Zealand. Their work is vital. Every day 56 people are diagnosed with breast cancer and sadly nine lives are lost to the disease. The team's efforts help ensure that research continues, treatments advance and hope grows stronger for those affected.
